Supporting your Junior

- **Listen** with an open mind and heart when your student shares what they are learning in College Guidance, how they are approaching the idea of MATCH
- Support your student without taking over the process (example: remind your student to attend college fairs and information sessions, help create organizational tools and methods to keep track of deadlines, etc.)
- Attend College Counseling events for parents (example: College Funding Night, Senior Parent Night, etc.)
- Observe when your student is stressed, and assist in finding ways to de-stress
- **Reassure** your student that they are going to find the right MATCH college for themselves and their worth should not be defined by an admission decision



- Mid to late-March, receive your admission decision (EDII, RD)
- Review financial aid awards
- Further research of admitted colleges

- If waitlisted, submit form for continued consideration (and additional documents)
- Attend in-person/virtual admitted events
- Send final documents to colleges (if applicable)
- Complete housing forms (if applicable)

Senior Year Timeline



May 1st = submit enrollment deposit*

- Attend in-person/virtual
 Orientation programming
- Meet with Advisor(s)
- Register for first year classes
- Final official transcript sent
- Take placement exams (if applicable)
- Fulfill housing obligations
- Fulfill financial aid obligations

May 1st is the national reply date to enroll, but some might have a different deadline so check with your college!

Supporting your Senior

- **Support** your student through the various admission decisions they will receive (Admit, Defer, Deny, Waitlist)
- Navigate the process of making a final decision with your student
- Review financial aid awards (if applicable)
- Assist with a "plan B" for additional colleges to apply to if needed
- **Discuss / prepare** for the upcoming transition to college
- Deposit your intent to enroll by May 1st to ONLY ONE college
